Baptist Missionary Society to Foreign Office. — (Received June 25.)

Sir,

19, Farnival Street, Holborn, June 24, 1907.

I AM directed by the Committee of the Baptist Missionary Society to acknowledge the receipt of your communication of the 17th instant, in regard to the loan of the Mission steamer "Peace" to Mr. Armstrong, His Majesty's Vice-Consul at Leopoldville, in the Congo State.

I have to inform you that the telegraphic message was sent to our Mission station at Stanley Pool giving them commission to make arrangements for Mr. Armstrong to use the Mission steamer, and it is not improbable that Mr. Armstrong has already left Stanley Pool with the vessel, although we have at present received no exact information.

In regard to the conditions upon which the steamer is lent, I should be glad if you would allow me the opportunity of explaining, in a few minutes' personal interview, the reason for the stipulations which are laid down in my communication of the 28th ultimo. If you will be so good as to let me know at what hour I can see you any day of the present week you will render us a great service.
