SIR,  
In reply to the Ambassador's letter (16315/1907) of  
the 15th instant I am to say that in accordance to the  
further representations of the Earl of Malmesbury in the Lords  
Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury will not insist on  
the stipulation that the appointment of Director of  
Agriculture in the East Africa Protectorate shall be  
unpensionable.

It will be seen generally to the grant of  
pension rights to the principal subordinate officials in  
the Department provided that this concession is confined  
to such officers as are likely to be required for permanent  
service in the Department in its ultimate form, and that  
no vested rights are created which might prove inconvenient  
hereafter in the event, e.g. of its being found desirable,  
as the Protectorate develops, to reduce the Department.

I am to enquire whether it is desired to confer  
pension rights immediately on any of the principal  
appointments, and if so, in what cases.
