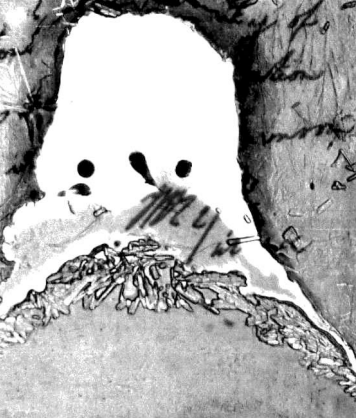

Sir,

I have laid before the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury Mr. Antebus' letter (25223/1907) of the 19th ultimo and its enclosures in regard to certain defalcations in the Post Office cash at Kericho in the East Africa Protectorate.

In reply I am to request you to convey to the Earl of Elgin the sanction of this Board for the write-off, as irrecoverable, of the gross amount in question, viz: Rs. 1513.0a.1p. An explanatory note should be added to the account to the effect that by a saving of Rs. 252.15a.2p in respect of security deposit and salary due to the Postmaster, the actual loss has been reduced to Rs. 1260.0a.3p.
