Sir,

In reply to Mr. Antropus's letter of the 20th instant (32992/1907), further respecting the construction of a sidings on the Uganda Railway, I am directed by the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury to request you to inform the Earl of Elgin that, if no unallocated Capital is available, the expenditure (£7,000) must be deferred until it can be met in the usual way by provision in the Estimates of the Protectorate, - unless money can be found from the balance (about £80,000) of the unallocated surplus of the East Africa Protectorate which it is proposed to apply to the development of the railway (vide the letter from this Department of the 27th March last, No. 4769/07.)
