

Sir,

In reply to Mr. Just's letter (38049/1907) of the 5th instant, I am to request you to inform the Earl of Elgin that the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury concur in His Lordship's proposal to inform the Governor of the East Africa Protectorate that it is not necessary to insure against fire the stores in charge of the Public Works Department.

It is Their Lordships' general policy that public stores, in the custody of public officials, should not be insured.

The Secretary of State will doubtless impress on the local officials that every possible precaution must be taken to guard against fire.
