My Lord,

I have the honour to acknowledge the receipt of your letter of the 16th ultime referring to the report to you by the Acting Commissioner of the East Africa Protectorate that the Masai in the southern reserve complain that they are prevented by the Syndicate's representative from obtaining water from the Magadi Lake.

I am directed to inform you that some time since the Syndicate's Manager complained to the Board that passes were issued to natives to obtain salt from Magadi without his permission of previous knowledge and he submitted a copy of a pass, dated the 6th November, 1906, in favour of 12 natives, and signed by F. G. Hamilton, Assistant Collector.

The Board was aware of the existence of the alleged another system of the Masai in the southern reserve but, in view of the representation made to your lordship, my Board is willing to agree to the suggestions made in paragraph 3 of your letter, provided the Syndicate's representative receives cordial support from the Protectorate officials in any endeavour to prevent the taking of soda for trading purposes, and also provided, in the event of the working of the soda not resulting in a profit (as is probable in the earlier operations of the

Syndicate or the Soda Company proposed to be formed) that any soda supplied to the Government for the Naval be held to the credit of the Syndicate or such Soda Company in respect of payment of royalty whatever it may happen due subsequent to profit being earned.
