My attention has recently been called to the charges made for the maintenance and treatment of patients in the European Hospitals in East Africa, and more particularly to the amount charged for non-official patients.

Medical Officer, recommended a sliding scale of charges
for officials and a fixed charge of seven runees per diem
for non-official patients. The Marquess of Lansdowne
in reply stated in his despatch No. 879 of July 1st that
the introduction of a sliding scale of charges for officials
would be open to various objections, and ruled that the
sum of three rupees hitherte charged should be maintained
whilst in the case of non-official patients the rate

the sliding scale of charges for officials I should not care to press the matter, though it appears to me that it is hard on such officials as Sergeant Instructors of Police and clerks, whose salary is only one hundred and fifty or two hundred bounds per annum, being obliged to pay the same as officials drawing four or five times as much. Should you on the other hand approve of a sliding scale, I would recommend the following, which has been drawn up by the Principal Medical Officer:-
