SIR G. PARKER asked the hon. gentleman when a Legislative Council was to be given to British East Africa; whether a white police were to be organized, and of what kind; and what provisions were being taken meanwhile to protect the lives and property of Europeans.

Mr. CHURCHILL.—The Secretary of State cannot at present name a date for the establishment of the proposed Legislative Council, as the force of white police is being recruited locally, and it is not clear to what extent the necessity for European police will be obviated by the native police than with the present force. The lives and property of Europeans are being protected by the native police, and it is not believed to be in any danger, and the force is being afforded by the native
