

employed in any other service or business whatsoever, or  
receive commissions or profits of any kind, but shall  
devote the whole of his time and attention to the service  
of the Secretary of State, and shall use his utmost ex-  
ertions to promote the interests of the Secretary of State.

5. The person engaged undertakes to use his diligence  
to acquire such a colloquial knowledge of the Hindooostan  
language as will satisfy the examiners appointed for the pur-  
pose, that he is able to give directions to and understand  
reports from the Indian labourers employed on the works,  
during which the Committee may at their discretion ter-  
minate his engagement at the end of nine months from the  
date of his landing at Mombasa without further notice.

6. The person engaged shall at all times act under the  
instructions of the Chief Engineer of the works, or such  
other officer as the Secretary of State, through the Com-  
mittee, may set in authority over him.

7. The person engaged shall be paid a salary of Three  
hundred pounds per annum. Salary will commence on date  
of embarkation, and will be paid during the voyage out  
to Mombasa, and will also be paid on the voyage home  
again.
