Dear Sir,

With reference to my interview with you on
Thursday last, and to the understanding which we came to
regarding my Firm being granted (on terms to be arranged)
a Lease of Rubber territory in the East Africa Protectorate
or Uganda, and referring to your request that I should put in
writing what we desire, I have pleasure in submitting the
following for your approval:

In the first place, you mentioned that enquiries
as to our responsibility would be made, and I beg to refer
you to our Bankers, Messrs. Barclay & Co., of Lombard Street,

We will also enter into whatever agricultural steps will be necessary to increase the Rubber producing capacity of the Forest, by preserving the trees, and by making clearings and planting.

We will be ready to enter into a lease for 21 years, renewable for a further 21 years.

As already explained to you, we are closely allied with the largest Consumers of Rubber in the World, and the leases we wish to acquire would not be used for Stock Exchange purposes.

We are now engaging a suitable Agent to send to the East Africa Protectorate and Uganda, and as soon as we can determine upon the precise area, we will ask him to arrange a lease with the Crown Agent, as this is the course indicated by you.

We will, when our plans are further forward, ask you to kindly furnish our representative with the facilities to the authorities in the East Africa Protectorate and
