2. Lord E. approves generally

you have selected,
but I am to ~~express~~
~~regret~~ remind you
that the object of

holding the course
of one ^{in every} four
months is in
view that as
many officers as
possible may
receive instruction.

2. The lectures
should therefore be
^{the whole of} spread over that
period, and not
~~complete~~ delivered
at such frequent
intervals that the
course is completed
some time before
the ~~opening of~~
commencement
of the next ~~course~~
period of four months.

3. It is possible
that under this system
some officers may
be unable to attend
the lectures at

the beginning or the end
of the course, since
their period of residence
at Dublin may not
synchronize with that
of those mentioned,
but this would
appear to be unavoidable.

4. I am to observe that
no mention of an
exhibits is made in
the syllabus enclosed
your letter under reply.

It is presumed, however,
that the lectures will
be illustrated with
diagrams, etc., and that
it will be glad to learn
what ^{could be involved by} expenditure ^{of the}
provision of the necessary
materials for the
purpose.
