

2. Take the opportunity
of drawing your attention
to the apparently unduly
favorable terms in which
the lease of 30 square
miles at Kibungu was
granted to Mr. Huetner.
since he has been able
to obtain for $\frac{1}{32}$ of an acre
of the area a larger rent
than he pays to the Govt.
for the whole.

3. When the question of the
renewal of his lease comes
up the clause relating to
the cultivation of the land
to the satisfaction of the
Govt. should be strictly en-
forced, and the amount
of land included in the
renewal lease should be
a reasonable proportion to
the amount of cultivation
performed by the lessee

4. I should like to
furnish you with a

I don't think, as I told Mr.
Williams that we can do more than
send this out to the Govt for his
consideration. We have limited ourselves
to the F.O. not to grant rubber rights
except in the form of a lease of
the land on which it is growing
+ the grant of such a lease in
a Native Reserve seems inconsistent
with the idea of a Reserve.
It seems to me that this is
