With reference to your 24569/1907 enclosing copy of telegram from the Governor of the East African Protectorate, I beg to say that I quite agree as to the advantage of moving the site of the Indian Bazaar and laying out and draining the site, as specified. It is also very important that the site of the government offices, the oil and police lines should be drained.

I think the work required by the Committee could be quite well done providing the main drainage of the town proper is done during next year.

There is an advantage in the fact that the work required is not a great distance from my starting point of 6½ miles. I have been told that it would be possible to lay out the new site in about a month. I am now in touch with the Government Engineers and I understand that it is now agreed that the estimated cost for this work the Governor should be informed that detailed plans and estimates will be sent off in about a month's time, and that in

(2) I think the course recommended by the Committee could be quite well adopted providing the main drainage of the town proper is gone on with next year.

(3) There is an advantage in the fact that the work suggested is much simpler from an engineering point of view than the construction of the main sewer. And it may be found that the Public Works Department will be in a position to cope with the latter.

(4) I would suggest that in order to facilitate this work the Governor should be informed that detailed plans and estimates will be sent off in about a month's time, and that

the meantime my drainage work should be carried out as far as possible on the lines of the plans attached to my report. There will probably be no difficulty in fitting such work in with the detailed plans when they arrive.

I have now practically finished the plans, specification and estimate of the main intercepting sewer, but will keep them back until all the plans for the completed scheme are ready and will then send them all together.

In the meantime the list of materials sent with my letter of the 10th. inst. is cancelled. In all probability the Director of Public Works has sufficient stores available to make a commencement with the works which when necessary.
