In reply to Your Lordship's despatch No. 6th November 19th asking whether there were any objections to the importation of sulphate of Strychnine into this Protectorate, I have the honour to report that it is, in my opinion, most desirable that the importation and distribution of this and other poisons, should be controlled by the Government. I would propose to import a quantity of strychnine, which should be in the charge of the Director of Agriculture and should only be issued to approved applicants for the purpose of killing vermin. There is however no law to prevent the importation of poisons by private individuals, and
