With reference to Colonial Office despatch No. 764 of December 8th 1906, I have the honour to report that since August last, when Mr. Jackson's work came under my supervision, it has been entirely satisfactory. In October last he was detailed for service with the forest demarcation party and since then has been in camp with and working under the daily supervision of Mr. Arthur Baker, who is in charge of the forest demarcation party. Mr. Arthur Baker's report on Mr. Jackson's services is attached herewith.

I recommend that Mr. Jackson be confirmed in his present appointment, his pay and promotion being regulated hereafter according to the schedule rates printed in my report on the forests of British East Africa.

I have the honour to report that Mr. W. B. Jackson has been a member of the Survey party of which I have been in charge since October 3rd 1907, and has been of the greatest assistance to me.

He is a hard worker and a sound practical surveyor. He has, apparently, not had much practice in trigonometrical surveys on a large scale, but he knows the theory.

I consider that after the experience gained during the survey upon which we are now engaged he will be competent to carry out a triangulation survey over an extensive area of country.

He is thoroughly conversant with the rougher methods of surveying, such as plane tabling and traversing with prismatic compass. He has an exceptionally good eye for the country and sketches well.
