The principal sum due from a farmer being
Rs 900 he pays 4 annual instalments and
in the 5th year able to pay the rest of his
debt in a lump sum -

1/ Under sec 14 he has to pay 6 annual
instalments as per schedule - i.e. Rs 638

2/ But if he were taken to have paid $\frac{1}{10}$ of the
principal sum ^{with interest} in the first year Rs 90, he
has the amount of the principal sum then
outstanding not Rs 540 - and I suggest
that he should be allowed to repay the Rs 540
with one year's interest -

3/ the smallest sum at 5% he would have to
pay Rs 556. 20

[Even if it were increased to 6% he would have to
pay only Rs 567]

I submit that this arrangement is more
reasonable than one of 1% and 2% to be substituted
for it
