Sir,

With reference to paragraph 49 of my letter No. 108a/130 of the 20th ultime reporting on the Estimates, I have the honour to inform you that I discussed the estimates of the 3rd Battalion of the King's African Rifles with Colonel Gough, Inspector General, King's African Rifles and I attach a copy of a minute by him on the subject.

It will be observed that Colonel Gough recommends the abolition of the post of Assistant Paymaster from 1st April 1909 and the retirement of the present holder of the post, Mr. Cowasjee Khan-batta. Mr. Gibson, Assistant Comptroller and Auditor, also commented on the high rate of salary drawn by Mr. Cowasjee and, as it does not appear that he could be employed in any other department, at his present rate of pay, I have the honour to suggest that a pension be granted to him on the abolition of

the post.

3. If this suggestion meets with your approval, the Officer Commanding 3rd King's African Rifles should be requested to fill in a pension application form for Mr. Cewajee.

4. In view of the now probable non-disbandment of the Foreign Service Battalion of the King's African Rifles and with reference to paragraph 13 of my letter quoted above I have also the honour to enclose detailed estimates of the battalion for 1908-09 viz:

(1) the recurring expenditure amounting to £6000 which will require to be added to the Estimates as already submitted to the Colonial Office,

and (2) the extraordinary expenditure amounting to £8736, which will have to be substituted for the provision of £5436 made for the 1st King's African Rifles in Schedule 18a of the Estimates as sent home.

These estimates have also been scrutinized by Colonel Gough who has no comments to make thereon.

5. I understand that Colonel Gough is going to inspect the Police of the Protectorate and any question of rearrangement will have to await his report. The £8000 savings on the current year's

expenditure

Expenditure, which was reported in paragraph 11 of my letter, I had temporarily earmarked for the purpose of paying off and transporting the Foreign Service battalion back to Mysalana, will now be available for Police rearmament if decided upon.

6. If it is finally decided to retain the Foreign Service battalion of the King's African Rifles and not to rearm the Police, the position will be that next year's expenditure will be increased by £9011 but the reserve fund of accumulated balances will have been increased by £5000, so that the balance still available on 31st March 1908, as shown in Appendix D. to the estimate, will be reduced from £25823 to £1812.

The Paymaster of 3rd Bn. and Foreign Service would do one another's work to enable leave to be taken.

The extra pay was promised by Sir W. Manning last year - but please note that no new Native Officers are being made, so this item will eventually die out.

Asst: Band-master. At present the Asst: Bandmaster is being paid for from band vote. The latter has been reduced £20 - so extra cost is £28 for Asst: Bandmaster.

As for Band Sergeant this man's pay was raised so slight increase above a Pte Soudanese. Recommended.
