I am directed by the Secretary of State for the Colonies to
inform you that, subject to your being passed as physically fit for
service, he proposes to select you for probationary appointment as
Confidential Clerk in the Secretariat of the West African

Protectorate with salary at the rate of £200 a year,
rising to £300 a year by annual increments of £20,
and perquisites or an allowance in lieu thereof. In
the event of your being called upon to discharge the duties
of Clerk to the Legislative Council you will receive an additional
allowance of £250 a year.

2. A memorandum showing the general conditions attached to
appointments in the Protectorate is enclosed herewith, but you are to
understand that you will be subject to any regulations which may here-
after be introduced by or with the sanction of the Secretary of State.
A copy of the regulations as to pensions is also enclosed.

3. If you are prepared to accept the appointment on these
conditions, you should present yourself to one of the medical advisers of
this Department, whose names are given on the ^{enclosed} ~~attached~~ letter, for the
purpose of being medically examined. The letter is to be detached and
left with him; and you will be required to pay him a fee of one guinea.
He will send his report direct to this Department.
