My Lord,

With reference to Sir G. Cobb's letter of the 9th January last to Mr. Cobb which formed an enclosure to Your Lordship's despatch No. 15 of the 9th January last, I have the honour to submit copy of a minute by the Commissioner of Lands, dated the 20th ultimo, which sums up the result of an interview I lately had with Mr. Cobb, and with the results of which he has expressed himself as satisfied. A copy of the sketch map, referred to in the minute, is attached.

2. I anticipate no difficulty in the matter of roads to which the ordinary rules of the Protectorate will be applicable.

3. Your Lordship will observe that Mr. Cobb's right of access between the various parts of his land has been admitted.

The following were present at His Excellency's Office on the 19th March to discuss the question of the area to be set apart for Mr. Cobb's Agents:-

The Commissioner of Lands.

The Chief Conservator of Forests

Mr. E. Powys Cobb.

After some discussion His Excellency decided that the following areas should be included in the grant. The references are to a rough sketch plan (scale about 1 mile to 1 inch) which has been prepared in the Survey Office.

(a) A large horse shoe area beginning from glade C on the North West, following the line of forest on the West, southward, and including all large glades, to point G, then following line G-H.J. until the forest line is again reached on the south east; thence from J the forest line on the East including all large glades and bending round on E.E. to point K. K is the point where No. 1 river breaks through the heights which form the Western side of the Vale of Nepethis. Thence the crest of the said heights to point L at the Southern end of the line of timber. The line will then go West and bend round to the North so as to exclude a large area of swamp and bush hatched blue and marked E until glade C is reached again.

(b) The long strip running North and South called the Vale of Iles and Mervyn.

All small sides jutting into the forest with narrow entrances to be included in the Forest Reserve. Mr. Cobb to have

have a right to enter across the Forest areas in convenient places so as to give him access to various parts of his land. Mr.Cobb on the other hand engages to keep his cattle from trespassing in the Forest Reserve.

It will be seen that two large blocks E and F are excluded from the grant and retained in the Forest Reserve; E being swamp and bush where streams arise, and F, being scrub and bush unsuited to Mr.Cobb. Mr.Cobb will ask Mr.Macdonald, Director of Agriculture, to advise as to the limits of these two blocks. In the meanwhile they can be marked off by the Surveyor as pointed out on the ground by Mr.Cobb.

The lines are roughly drawn and only approximate.
