Telegram. The Governor of the East Africa Protectorate.

Secretary of State for the Colonies.

(Received, General Office 4.42 p.m. 13th April, 1908)

April 13th. In the reply which I have to give to an address from the Asiatic community, urging a disrepect and anti-Banner claim to representation by a seat on the Legislative Council, I propose to recall the long connexion of Indians with East Africa, their increasing numbers and influence on the trade of the Protectorate, and to say that I consider that these constitute a legitimate claim which I will submit to you for your favourable consideration. Do you approve? You will remember that when the Council was first formed I thought it expedient to defer consideration of the appointment of an Indian member. I think it could fairly be done now.

Signatories are sending to His Majesty to Ministers and English Press copies of their address.
