It has been brought to my notice that Mr. R.D. Brown, lately appointed an Assistant District Commissioner in this Protectorate Service, made an arrangement with the Crown Agents for the Colonies before his departure whereby he received two second class passages for himself and his wife on payment of the difference between their cost and that of a single first class passage.

Such a course has never previously been allowed to be taken by an officer of the interior staff and I have the honour to place a minute on the subject by one of my predecessors and by the Treasury. I shall be glad if the procedure which has been followed in this case may be followed in future.

been exceeded and Dr Narain would have been obliged to pay
the difference.
