My Lord,

As Colonel Gough has undertaken an enquiry into the re-organization of the Protectorate Police, I invited his opinion as to the necessity or otherwise of continuing flogging. He reports that flogging is in his opinion necessary. It should, however, become less frequent as the discipline of the Force improves and civilization increases. Colonel Gough's view would, therefore, seem to be in accord with the opinion I have already expressed.
