The OFFICER COMMANDING THE

WEST AFRICA PROTECTORATE

Sir,

With reference to the question of "INTELLIGENCE" in the West Africa Protectorate, the Inspector General has decided that the present system is unsatisfactory and the information afforded your department, not that which you require.

I, therefore, propose to reorganise the system, and as a first step in that direction I am now engaged in collecting information on lines laid down by the Inspector General, regarding such tribes as may possibly give us trouble in the future. I hope shortly to forward you a Report on the SOMALIS of JURALAND, the MAHAL etc.

The present quarterly Report will, with your approval, be discontinued, and instead I propose to submit you at the time of its receipt any information which I may consider of sufficient interest and importance to be laid before you.
