My Lord,

I have the honour to submit copy of a note from Mr. W.A. Davies asking that his name may be laid before Your Lordship for an appointment as Assistant District Commissioner in this Protectorate.

Mr. Davies' application for the post of Contyanager in the Land Office, was submitted with my despatch No. 504 of the 6th January 1908. Before Mr. Davies sent in his present application he saw me and asked if he had a chance of obtaining an appointment on the Administrative Staff. In reply I told him I was unable to hold out hopes of such an application being favourably entertained, that there were a number of applicants, and that candidates were now generally selected from those who had a University training.

3. He is a gentlemanly young man, of agreeable character and has a legal training. In the failure of other qualified candidates his application might be considered.

4. He has since left for England.
