The object of this Ordinance is to enable the Municipal Council of each Township to collect conservancy fees. Certain test cases were taken to recover assessment rates under the Township Ordinance 1903 and rules thereunder 1904 (7-20) in which the rates have been held by the High Court to be illerally imposed. The Municipal Council could not carry out the conservancy work of the Town. If the assessment rates had been assunded it would have taken months before the rates could have been legally explied as the rate payers sould have had to have time to appeal against the assessment, From the new Fonistpal Ortinance comes into force there will also be enforced a new rating Ordinance dealing with the whole case of rating. This Ordinance only seals with a fee for services remerely and is only a temperary measure.
