I have the honour to submit herewith the half yearly returns and to make the following explanations and remarks with regard to the various causes of the delay in
the completion of the deeds for various applications.

1.2. Fending negotiations and pending Survey. — In the case
of the Joast applications, I am afraid that there may be
some further delay in dealing with applications. It has
been found to be almost impossible to ascertain the peatties and screage of land which is free from Bative Rights.

3. Pending plans. — I understand that the stair of the Sadastral Branch of the Survey Department is new in a position to deal with and souplete deed Plans with prospetitude and most of the cases included in these returns will be disposed of before the end of the current year. In some cases however owing to disputes and questions arising by reason of failure on the part of Licensed Surveyors to properly beason the areas surveyed, a certain

amount of delay is unavoidable.

- Pending return of draft deeds .- The Land Office cannot in any way be held reponsible for the delay in these emes. I regret to say that this delay im, in many cases, Intentional; applicants who have not ested for, or been given, fempowary becapetion Rights delay the return of their deeds in order to avoid the payment I have referred this matter to the Menourable the Commissioner of Lands who has approved my preposal to draw up a notice advising the public that in future rent will be charged from the day the draft deed is dee patched from this Office, except in cases where rent is already being paid by helders of femporary accupation Rights: In order to deal with the dames mentioned in these returns I propose to give notice that arter a con tain time date (giving a reasonable time) rest will be charged enall applications for which draft deeds mave been issued.
- once delay is caused by the immediate, on the part of applicants, to meet the descends for payment of rest and these which are issued with the counterpart deeds. In many times the amounts asked for are large, and as payment must be received in full before the deeds can be registered, and the applicant may be un-country, delay is star unavoidable. In other cases, distinct the second have been engroused thick received.

In conclusion, I am pleased to be able to report that there is every prespect of the arrears mentioned in these returns being considerably reduced during the next six menths and, with the cooperation of the applicants and provided that questions now pending with other resurt ments can be promptly settled, I consider that all pending applications could be disposed or before the issue of the next returns.

with the help of the Conveyancer, I will endeavour to dispose of all these arrears, but I must add that, or ing to the everage of the Land Officer on leave and the amount of work on hand, our time will be very fully occupied.
