My Lord,

I have the honour to report that in the Crown Agents' Account with this Protectorate for April there appears a payment of £1,000, in the form of a Bill drawn by H.M. Minister at Mts Ababa for Frontier Protection Service, and in the June Account another payment of £700 appears for "Advanced Southern Frontier Inspector".

It is stated in one of the enclosures to Your Lordship's despatch Confidential of 28th April that a sum of £8,500 to be paid out of the Colonial Services Vote will be required for the work of the Boundary Commission, and it is presumed that these payments should be made out of that amount. I should be glad to know whether my presumption is correct and if so, whether instructions may be issued to the Crown Agents that these sums should not be debited against this Protectorate.
