FROM Lieutenant G.L.JORDAN, R.R.

To His Honour the Lieutenant Governor.

Sir,

I have the honour to request that His Excellency the Governor may be apprised with a view to special consideration of a Sportsman's licence granted me on the 9th instant.

Being an officer of H.M. service stationed in the Transvaal, on four months' leave to the United Kingdom and being desirous of seeing some sport in the S.E.A. Protectorate, I have broken my journey and taken out a licence at Nairobi value Rs.750. I proposed spending six weeks shooting but owing to alteration in plans on account of my companion Major Horshagh A.S.C.'s wife's illness, have been only able to manage a fortnight namely 9th to 23rd instant. As the expense of the licence is a serious consideration to me, I beg to request that under the special circumstances my licence may be put on the Rs.150 scale or other reduced scale as thought fit and the balance refunded to me D/c Messrs. Cox & Company 16 Charing Cross, London. S.W.
