I have the honour to report that in accordance with the recommendations of a Medical Board, I have directed that European Police Constable G. Carey be returned to England as unfit for further duty in this Protectorate.

2. Police Constable Carey sailed for England by the steamer of the 23th ultimo: a copy of the proceedings of the Medical Board, and his last pay certificate are enclosed herewith.

The Board having assembled proceed to examine Police Constable Carey. The patient arrived in East Africa on 11th September 1907 and was at first stationed in Nairobi. During this portion of his service which extended over about ten months he was taken on the sick list because of a rupture in the right side of chest. He left Nairobi for Molo Station on 10th June 1908 and since then

patient has been for some time
 this request of his service under the
 care of the Medical Officer at
 Nakuru, complaining again of pain
 in the chest, but in the left side.
 He states that during this last
 part of his ill-health, he has suffered
 from a cough which frequently prevents
 him from obtaining sufficient amount
 of sleep, that he has lost over three
 stones in weight, and that he
 experiences a considerable amount of
 perspiration at night. Further, that
 his appetite is poor and that he
 has been unfit for duty for quite
 half of the time since 18th June 19
 The Board find on examination of the
 patient that there is comparative
 dulness beneath the right clavicle,
 and that moist sounds are audible
 in auscultation both in this situation
 and over the anterior upper lobe of
 right lung -

The Board are therefore of opinion
 that Police Constable Gilbert Carey is
 suffering from early pulmonary tuberculosis
 and recommend that he be invalided
 to England as unfit for duty in the
 East Africa Protectorate


LAST PAY CERTIFICATE.

This is to certify that Police Constable G. Carey has received full pay up to October 19th 1908 the date on which he was declared medically unfit for further service.

2. He has received $\frac{1}{2}$ pay from October 26th to November 17th 1908 the date upon which it is anticipated he will arrive in England.

3. He has been refunded the amount deducted from his salary as security for the cost of his passage from England on first appointment.

4. He has no further claim on the East Africa Protectorate Government except perhaps for a railway fare to Aldershot.
