My Lord,

With reference to my confidential despatch No. 110 of the 15th of October reporting the resignation of Mr. E. L. Waring, Deputy Director of Surveys, Cadastral Branch, I have the honour to recommend that Mr. A. E. Townsend, at present Assistant Director of Surveys, Cadastral Branch, be appointed to the vacant post. He has acted for Mr. Waring at different periods, is tactful with his subordinates and prompt in his work. He served for three years in West Africa and had previous experience in Queensland and is I consider in every way well qualified for the post.

2. To fill the vacancy thus caused I have the honour to recommend the appointment of Mr. T. M. Galbraith to succeed Mr. Townsend as Assistant Director Cadastral Branch. He is now the senior of

the District Surveyors, and appears to be well fitted for promotion.

3. To replace him I propose, subject to Your Lordship's sanction, to appoint Mr. F.H. Jordan who is now a Licensed Surveyor in the Protectorate. It was originally intended to offer him an appointment on the occurrence of a vacancy in December last, but this was not possible owing to the transfer of Mr. Stiles from Uganda. Mr. Jordan is competent for the work, and I do not consider that the claims of any of the present Senior Staff Surveyors are such as should preclude this appointment. Mr. Lloyd who is the senior of them was promoted as recently as April 1907.
