My Lord.

With reference to Your Lordship's despatch No. 561 of the 31st of July last, I have the honour to transmit herewith two, authenticated and ten printed copies of the Land Titles Ordinance 1906, as amended and passed in the Legislative Council.

2. The amendments do not strictly follow the provisions of the Ceylon Ordinance to which Your Lordship has referred and the reasons for this divergence are fully explained in the Memorandum by the Crown Agents which is enclosed.

3. It is very necessary that the enquiry into these titles should commence without further delay, and I have therefore as a matter of urgency requested

final paragraph of his Memorandum can be adopted.


