I have today examined Lieut. Genl. Colonel J. M. Patterson, D.S.O., Chief Game Ranger in the East Africa Protectorate, and have the honor to report that he is thin and anaemic and that he is suffering from chronic dysentery. There is distinct thickening of one part of the bowel.

I do not consider he is fit to return to Africa on 11th November and would recommend that he be granted three months extension of leave from that date and that three months from today's date he be reexamined.
