Sir I am directed by to
 inform you, that for the
 reason of the L.C. of
 the Treasury, that
 there is no provision in
 the present Estimates
 of the G. A. P. for the
 salary of the
 Collector at His Majesty's
 The duties of this
 office have been dis-
 charged for the
 last three years by
 Captain Palkfield

at the rate of £500 a year

who serves as a
Company Commander
in the N.A.R.

3. It will be seen from
the des. of which a copy
is enclosed that the
late Commr. considered
it of great importance
that Capt. Palkeld
should be retained in
his position, owing
to the advantage which
his past experience
gave him in dealing
with the warlike
tribes of that part of the
country.

4. The H.O. however,
would not allow Capt.
Palkeld to be rewarded
by a further term of
5 years as a Company
Commander: and

P. P. Stewart to P. P.

and I am to say
that the present
Commr. concurs
in this view.

there is, moreover, a serious
anomaly in substituting
the rank of political
dates of a Collector
to an officer who is
at the same time a
subordinate officer in
a subordinate post.

5. Mr. Inglis would
readily prefer that
provision should be made
at once for the
re-establishment of
the office of Collector
at Kisumu. It will
probably cost the
Government ^{£500} ~~£400~~ per
annum, in order that Capt.
Palkeld may be
appointed to it at
the termination of
his present period of
service with the N.A.R.
