TREASURY CHAMBERS.

Sir,

In reply to Mr. Antrobus's letter of the 27th April last I am to say, for the information of Secretary the Earl of Crewe, that the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury agree subject to the reservation made below that Mr. Edmondson, Veterinary Officer, and Captain Neave, Live Stock Inspector, in the East Africa Protectorate may, if willing to continue service in the Protectorate, be permanently appointed and receive pension rights as from the date of their original engagements.

I am, however, to point out that My Lords have not assented to the scale of £400 - 20 - £500 (now provided in the Estimates) for Veterinary Officers as a pensionable salary: and They must ask that Mr. Edmondson, on being made pensionable, shall be placed on a salary of £400 per annum, fixed, the amount sanctioned for permanent Veterinary Assistants by Treasury letter (13428/05) of 20th July 1905. Such a reduction of emolument will accord with the principle laid down in paragraph 11 of Mr. Antrobus's letter (2928) of 24th February 1905.

I have the honor to inform you, with reference to my predecessor's app't to 1902 of the Est. of October last, that in consequence of a letter received from the Chief Secretary Office I have given further consideration to the question of placing Mr. Nease and Mr. Astropus on the establishment of the Treasury Dept., on the permanent staff, and to inform you that if you are still satisfied with the arrangements of their offices, I shall be of your opinion that it is permanent and pensionable app't. at the termination of their present engagements, at

fixed salaries of £400 a year
in each case, permissible service
to be reckoned from the date of their
original engagements.

2. This Scale of £400 increased

a year, rising by £20
annually to £500, provided
for Veterinary ^(and the Live Stock Inspector) Officers in

the Estimates, has not
been approved as a
permissible salary; and

in view of this fact and
in accordance with the
general principle that
an officer should be
appointed to a permissible
post at a salary somewhat
lower than his non-permissible
remuneration, I am not
prepared to offer Doctor
~~Cawdron~~ Cawdon a higher
salary than £400.
