letter told him that he would be

for purposes of leave.

His 2 years is up on 14 April  
next.

Sir,

I have the honour to transmit to you herewith the leave and last pay certificate of Mr. E. C. Foot, Assistant Conservator of Forests, together with a copy of the proceedings of a Medical Board held for the purpose of reporting on this officer's state of health.

2. Mr. Foot who is, on a two years agreement, has been incapacitated from work for some months. As his illness was contracted in the execution of his duty by repeated wettings experienced while surveying the forests during the rainy season, I have the honour to recommend that he be treated as generously as possible, and I would suggest that he be given the six months' leave proposed by the

Doctors. At the end of this period I would recommend  
 that his services be dispensed with as it is evident he  
 cannot stand the climate. I would add here that I am  
 given to understand that Mr. Foot was unable to pass the  
 medical examination for the Indian Woods and Forests  
 Department, and he is in consequence not likely to be of  
 much use in East Africa.

The Board having assembled proceed to examine Mr Foots and find that suffering from Chronic Synovitis of right kneejoint of nearly months duration.

The condition is probably the result of a prolonged attack of malaria which was caused by repeated wettings experienced while being forest during the rainy season leaving the muscles and joints of the affected limb in a relaxed condition, the *larynx* arthritis supervened after severe exertion.

I hereby certify that *Mr. E. G. Foots* has received full salary at the rate of £ *550* per annum up to the *31st of October* 1905, inclusive, and that he is entitled to salary at the rate of £ *550* per annum from the *1st of November* 1905 to the *31st of February* 1906, to salary at the rate of £ *550* from the *1st of March* 1906, to the *31st of October* 1906.

Mr. *Foots* has been provided with *half board* from Mombasa to London, and an allowance for expenses of £ *750* and is entitled to be provided with *passage and an allowance of £ *10* per week for salary pay to which passage allowance always be determined by the of Staff*
