Sir,

In the circumstances represented by the Earl of Crewe in Mr. Antrobus's letter of the 23rd ultimo (20756/1908), the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury sanction the appointment of an additional nursing sister at the European Hospital, Nairobi, with the usual salary of £165 a year plus £10 outfit allowance, and They agree to the subsequent appointment of one of the Staff of sisters, as Matron with a salary of £190 (including outfit allowance).

Their Lordships' sanction is given to these proposals on the understanding that the increase of admissions is expected to be permanent and that the extra cost during the present financial year can be met out of savings on the head "Hospitals and Dispensaries" in the Protectorate Estimates.

I am to ask what charges are made to patients in the hospital, and how far the expenses of staff and working are covered by receipts.
