the West African Medical
Staff, and that there are
several members of that
Staff now serving elsewhere
in W. Africa who have
applied for transfer to
Northern Nigeria, and when
applications of this sort are
necessary, it will be
necessary to consider
before those of other
candidates. There is no
vacancy at present.
