- (3) If he is transferred he will have to pay in at the bottom of the L.A. Staff list is junior to every one, & at the initial rate of salary £400.

Sir,

I am to ask the recd. of your letter of the 12<sup>th</sup> of May, in which you apply for a transfer to Northern Nigeria, and to inform you that medical officers in N. Nigeria are members of the West African Medical Staff, and that there are several members of that Staff now serving elsewhere in W. Africa who have applied for transfer to Northern Nigeria, and these applications it would be necessary to consider before those of other candidates. There is no vacancy at present.

2. If you were transferred to Northern Nigeria it would be necessary for you to enter the W. A. M. S. list at the bottom, and at the initial rate of salary £700 a year, as your service in East Africa could not be counted for
