My Lord,

I have the honour to call the attention of your Lordship - which I omitted to do in my letter of the 31st August - to that part of the minute of the Lieutenant Governor of S.E.A. in which he states, "I have therefore drawn up, in conjunction with Mr. Percival" etc.

I very strongly object to this proceeding. Mr. Percival is my subordinate and I was sent out to East Africa to supersede him. It is most improper, and subversive of all discipline, that he should have been called upon to assist in framing a case against me by drawing up a hypothetical estimate after the event.
