Wt. Read.

The suggestion is not unreasonable, if the bonus be confined strictly to P.W.D. or others who can prove to the Govt's satisfaction that Hindustani is useful. We should, however, lay the chief stress on native languages of the Prov., and perhaps this objection could best be answered, should we receive a reply to our despatch of the 21 June last. I wait till that reply comes.

My Lord,

I have the honour to recommend for Your Lordship's favourable consideration the inclusion of Hindustani among the languages for a knowledge of which a bonus of £50 is granted. My reason for making this suggestion is that a very large number of Indian artisans are employed by the Public Works Department and a knowledge of their language is of great material value to those who have to deal with them.

I would propose to limit the officers eligible for such a bonus to those of the Public Works Department and such other Departments as can prove
