Sale of Kivu Cattle

Mr. Fielder

550 head of cattle were captured
in the Kivu operations in 1908. Mr. Fielder
wanted to sell 300 of them to cables
(8400/100). But we raised difficulties,
and eventually it was agreed that he
might sell some of the cattle, not exceeding
1000, the proceeds being used for the
benefit of the Kivu and being put to
some purpose of utility such as a
dispensary or medical assistance (see
our tel. of 2nd April 1908 on $\frac{9600/100}{9600/100}$).
The balance of the cattle were to be

restored to the Kisu gradually (see
tel. of 14th March 1908 in ~~Gov. 892/0~~ ~~Gov. 4628/08~~)

The situation is not yet at all clear.
In view of the Parliamentary pledge
given in 1908 & the stand then taken on
it by His Dept., I think we must
get more information, even at the risk
of making Sir P. Girouard think that
we are worrying him. What we want
to know is

- (1) how many cattle were sold.
- (2) how the proceeds of the sale were
applied.
- (3) how many cattle were returned to
the Kisu
- (4) how many cattle remain in the
hands of the Govt.

Ask these questions by telegram?
