My Lord,

I have the honour to report that in view of the fact that there was not sufficient work at the Arboretum in Nairobi to occupy the whole time of a Forester, Mr.Barlow, Accountant in the Forest Office, was appointed to do this work in addition to his own duties thereby freeing a Forester for employment elsewhere. The Acting Conservator of Forests now asks hat he may be given an extra remuneration of £20 a year on this account.

Funds will be available from the Vote for Foresters in the current year's Estimates, and in accordance with the instructions contained in the last paragraph of Your Lordship's despatch No.510 of August 25th I have the honour to recommend the application for Your Lordship's favourable consideration as a temporary allowance until I have an opportunity of considering the whole organization of the Forest Department.
