Paraphrase of a telegram from the Governor of the East Africa  
Protectorate to the Secretary of State for the Colonies  
(Received, Colonial Office, 4.12 p.m. 13th October, 1909.)

---

If I am required to report on Uganda I  
request that I may receive instructions. It is  
desirable that I should be at Mombasa in the middle of  
November and also to have three weeks session of  
Council, November, December. I could leave at  
present, but otherwise it would have to be deferred  
until December, January.
