Sir:-

Secretary Sir E. Grey has had under consideration your letter 35510/09 of November 19th, containing certain proposals as to the transfer and custody of the records of the Court of Appeal for Eastern Africa at Zanzibar.

In reply I am directed to point out, for the information of the Secretary of State for the Colonies, that Sir E. Grey is advised that the "Eastern African Protectorates Order in Council 1909" abolished the Court of Appeal at Zanzibar, and created a new Court of Appeal in East Africa with such jurisdiction as might be conferred upon it by local ordinances.

The jurisdiction in appeals was not transferred from Zanzibar to Mombasa. Under the circumstances Sir E. Grey is of opinion that the existing records of the Zanzibar Court of Appeal should be preserved in Zanzibar.
