Gentlemen,

We are in receipt of your letter of the 29th of May on the subject of the dry dock of the Florence.

The explanations given are such as we can judge satisfactory, except that we should think that the bottom of the Dock will have to be lowered to give a sufficient depth between it and ship's keel. To raise the blocks only will diminish the available depth of the Dock. But those on the spot are the best judges of this.
