Sir,

With reference to Mr. Antrobus' letter of the 5th December last (43656/1908), relative to the subsidiary coinage in the East Africa Protectorate and Uganda, I am directed by the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury to acquaint you for the information of the Earl of Crewe that They see no objection to the issue of coins of the new pattern proposed by the Mint to the value of 250,000 rupees and 4,500 rupees of the 1 cent and  $\frac{1}{2}$  cent pieces respectively, on the understanding that the sum to be paid for the coinage will cover the necessary cost and charges of the Mint, and They are causing the necessary instructions to be sent to the Deputy Master of the Mint. My Lords understand that it is now definitely decided that this subsidiary coinage is to be of white metal.

As regards the steps which should be taken to legalise the new coins, My Lords agree that it will be sufficient to substitute the new 3rd schedule, a copy of which was forwarded to your Department by the Deputy Master of the Mint on the 27th August, for the existing 3rd schedule by means of Proclamations to be issued simultaneously by the Governors of the East Africa Protectorate and Uganda under the powers conferred on them
