Sir,

In reply to Mr. Antrobus' letter of the 20th March last (7347/1909), I am directed by the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury to request you to inform the Earl of Crewe that They sanction his proposal to place the Gaoler at Nairobi and the Clerk in the Registration of Documents Department upon scales of salary of £180 rising by annual increments of £10, the first increment to accrue from 1st April 1909 in each case but My Lords consider that the maximum of the scale, £210, proposed for the Registration Clerk should also be sufficient for the Gaoler.

In both cases My Lords request that these salaries may be regarded as personal to the present holders and that a note may be made in the estimates to that effect.

My Lords however would be glad to be informed whether so much of the work in the Registration of Documents Department as represents services on behalf of the general public is covered wholly or in part by fees and what revenue has been received from this source.
