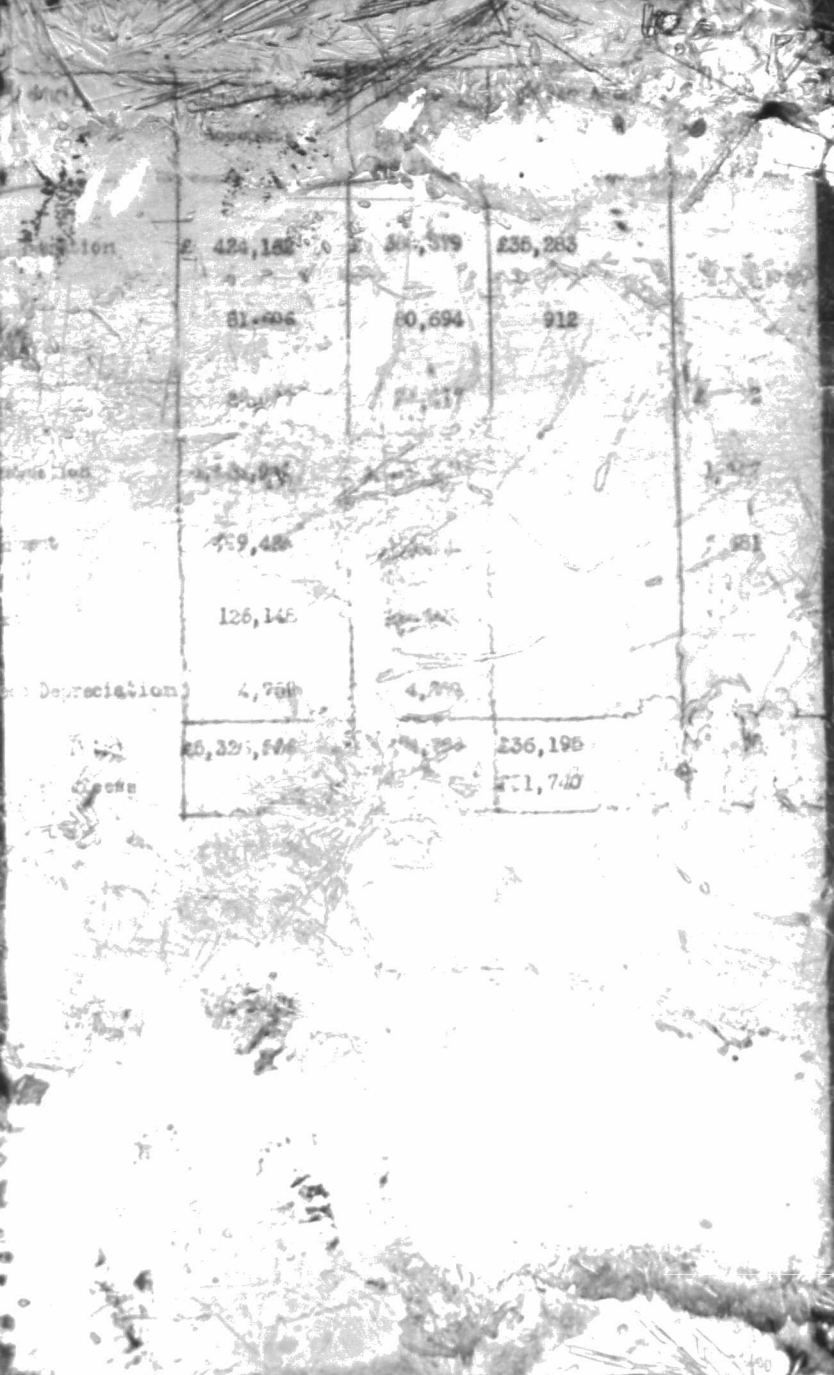

The amounts charged against the Administration account in England included many other charges beyond those given in the report under the heads of Crown Agents and other selected expenses of Committee's office and Central Administration.

10. The figures for the African figures are the sum of £29,100, 0/0. (Cases on the proposition which appertain to Administration account of the sum of £1973, 11. 1 which are shown in the African account for April 1899 as Gabon's balance, due to the re-valuation of the African account balance when the fixed rate adopted for the Rupee was changed from 1s 1/2 to 1s 1/4. It was decided by the Treasury to treat the "Gabon" by distributing it over the various parts of the account and the figures to be made up to be done were supplied by the Chief Registrar in his letter of the 11th January 1901 No. 705/17 and to inform the Treasury of the 7th March 1901 No. 15/17.

Sir,

I am directed by the Marquess of Lansdowne to acknowledge the receipt of your despatch No. 736 of the 15th inst. respecting the payment of fidelity guarantees to certain officers of the East Africa Protectorate.

The Marquess is of the opinion that the officers mentioned in your despatch have not been subjected to the security prescribed by the Regulations. This applies equally to officers serving under agreements.

It would appear that the officers mentioned in your despatch have not been complied with the Regulations owing to inadvertence in connection with the transfer of the two provinces from the Uganda to the East Africa Protectorate.

I am to request that the necessary steps may be at once taken to supply the deficiencies.
