Dear Sir,

Mr. Joseph Poulkes has handed to us your letter dated the 24th July forwarded to him in regard to the lease of two areas of ten thousand acres each near Malindi and has requested us to write you thereon.

Inaspuch as you desire that our client should specifically accept, without reservation, one of the alternatives as to the actual area to be leased to him in the letter of the 8th January 1909 we are instructed to say that our client selects to take the area had has asked for subject to all rights which may be proved to allet on any part of it.

Our olders fails vary strongly at being required to make this election in view of the circumstances under which he wisited the Protectorate and paid for the preliminary surveys and took the land in the first instance but unless the large amount of treatle time and ernemes to

to which he has been put is to be ign webally less to him he feels he has no alternative but to cleat in the number which we are now indicating.

We are unable to refer to the vergerath which you comminded in a letter from the vergerath to Sir Keneth Mackensis as we have not a copy or are we aware that our client has.

We presume that if it shoul! ultimately transpire that by reason of the native nights (which our client was ledg to believe monexistent) the quantity of land will be in a material degree less than 20,000 acres it will still be open for our clients to apply for further lands to an area not less than that by which the present area are reduced.

We are aware from the correspondence that you w will not in any way bind yourself to grant any such application but we should like to be able to inform our client that in the circumstances the application would be favourably considered and that he is not precluded from making it.

Our client also instructs us to state that he will be prepared in due course to provide the sum of £150 required by the Colonial Office.
