With reference to the contemplated appointment of a
Veterinary Bacteriologist for East Africa, an offer of which was
made to me in a telegram from the Governor of Nyassaland on November
7th 1908, I have the honour to inform you that I have as yet received
no reply to my last communication submitted to the Governor of East
Africa Protectorate through the Chief Veterinary Officer on February
20th 1909. The Secretariat Minute Paper referring to this letter
was circulated to me on the morning of my departure from Nairobi,
February 27th, and I noted that the sum of money asked for in order
to build and equip a working Laboratory had been found for the current
year, but that the question of salary had been referred Home for

qualified for the post, *and who has had experience in the employment of the Government School of Tropical Medicine.*

2. A sum of £600 has been provided on the current Estimates for the salary of ~~the post~~ ^{the post, but Lord Crewe is advised that,} in order to secure the services of Mr. Montgomery, it is desirable that he should be offered a permanent and pensionable appointment, subject to three years probation, and that if this is done a salary of £500 a year, rising after confirmation in the appt. at the end of three years to £525 and thence by annual increments of £25 to £600 a year, should be sufficient.

3. Lord Crewe considers that, in view of the large and increasing amount of live stock in the Prot. there can be no doubt that the services of a Veterinary Bacteriologist will be permanently required, and in these circs. he trust that their Lordships

will sanction the proposed arrangement.
